ROBERT MERGES, Wilson Sonsini Goodrich & Rosati Professor of Law and Technology, is Director, Berkeley Center for Law & Technology, University of California School of Law – Boalt Hall.

He has authored or coauthored three leading texts: *PATENT LAW AND POLICY: CASES AND MATERIALS*; *INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY IN THE NEW TECHNOLOGICAL AGE*; and *LEGAL PROTECTION FOR COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY*.

Other notable scholarship includes: *100 Years of Solicitude: IP Law, 1900-2000*, 88 CAL. L. REV. 2187 (2000); *A Transactional View of Property Rights*, 20 BERKELEY TECH. L.J. 1477 (2005); *The Story of Graham v. John Deere Co.*, in *INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY STORIES* (2006); and *Software and Patent Scope: A Report from the Middle Innings*, 85 TEX. L. REV. 1528 (2007). He is currently working on a book entitled *A THEORY OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY*.

Professor Merges teaches Patent Law, Historical Perspectives on IP, IP Scholarship Seminar, and Contracts, serves as a special consultant to the U.S. Department of Justice, Antitrust Division, and is a member of the Department's Task Force on Intellectual Property.
