Requirements for a Sound Theory

• Must be a clear, simple story, explaining what happened and why it happened.

• Must be consistent with the <u>credible admissible evidence</u> (includes undisputed facts and your version of disputed facts.

• Must be consistent with the <u>law</u> (why you should win or why your opponent should lose if they have burden of proof).

 Must be consistent with the jury's perception of how the world works.

Jury's Perception

• Universal beliefs, proverbs, slogans, sayings universally known.
