STUDENT POSTER COMPETITION

Presenting a poster is an excellent opportunity for young scholars to show their work in a visual format, promote discussion about their chosen subject, interact with seasoned academics and receive feedback about their projects.

1. Interested students should submit a 250 – 300 word abstract of original unpublished data at the SovereigntySymposium.com website under the Attend tab by March 27, 2026
2. Posters will be judged in separate undergraduate and graduate categories.
3. Students of accepted abstracts and must agree to prepare a poster representing the work in their abstract and to be available to discuss their work with visitors during an allocated time at the symposium.
4. Successful applicants will be required to register for the symposium as a student attendee.
5. More submission details and guidelines for the final poster projects will be made available to confirmed participants.
6. A special prize committee will select the best presentation.
