ROBERT MERGES, Wilson Sonsini Goodrich & Rosati Professor of Law and Technology, is Director, Berkeley Center for Law & Technology, University of California School of Law – Boalt Hall.

He has authored or coauthored three leading texts: PAT-ENT LAW AND POLICY: CASES AND MATERIALS; INTELLEC-TUAL PROPERTY IN THE NEW TECHNOLOGICAL AGE; and LEGAL PROTECTION FOR COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY.

Other notable scholarship includes: 100 Years of Solicitude: IP Law, 1900-2000, 88 CAL. L. REV. 2187 (2000); A Transactional View of Property Rights, 20 BERKELEY TECH. L.J.1477 (2005); The Story of Graham v. John Deere Co., in Intellectual Property Stories (2006); and Software and Patent Scope: A Report from the Middle Innings, 85 Tex. L. Rev. 1528 (2007). He is currently working on a book entitled A Theory of Intellectual Property.

Professor Merges teaches Patent Law, Historical Perspectives on IP, IP Scholarship Seminar, and Contracts, serves as a special consultant to the U.S. Department of Justice, Antitrust Division, and is a member of the Department's Task Force on Intellectual Property.
