UH Law Professor Emily Berman Available to Discuss Local and Federal Power Struggle in Washington, D.C.

Houston, Aug. 15, 2025 – The District of Columbia just filed an emergency motion to challenge federal control of its police force — setting up a high-stakes situation and raising questions about constitutional authority, local autonomy and the separation of powers.

Professor Emily Berman, with the University of Houston Law Center, says:

"The Trump administration's attempt at a hostile takeover of the D.C.

Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) displays two now-familiar
hallmarks of the president's frequent, unprecedented assertions of
executive power: (1) it relies upon the declaration of an "emergency" that
does not exist, and (2) it exceeds the statutory authority the president
would possess in the case of a genuine emergency. It is therefore
unsurprising that it has provoked pushback from local authorities
reluctant to cede control of their city to the president."

Berman is a constitutional law scholar with expertise in executive authority and national security and has been featured in The Washington Post and The New York Times. She can break down what's at stake, the legal arguments in play, and how the outcome could ripple far beyond D.C.
